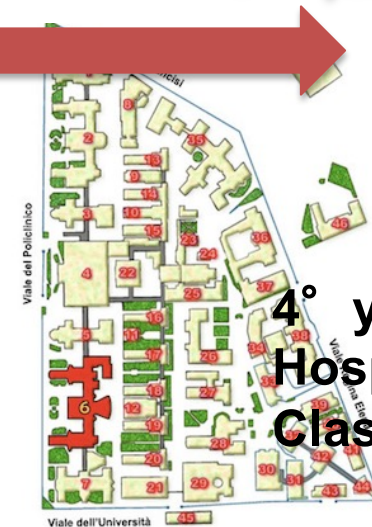

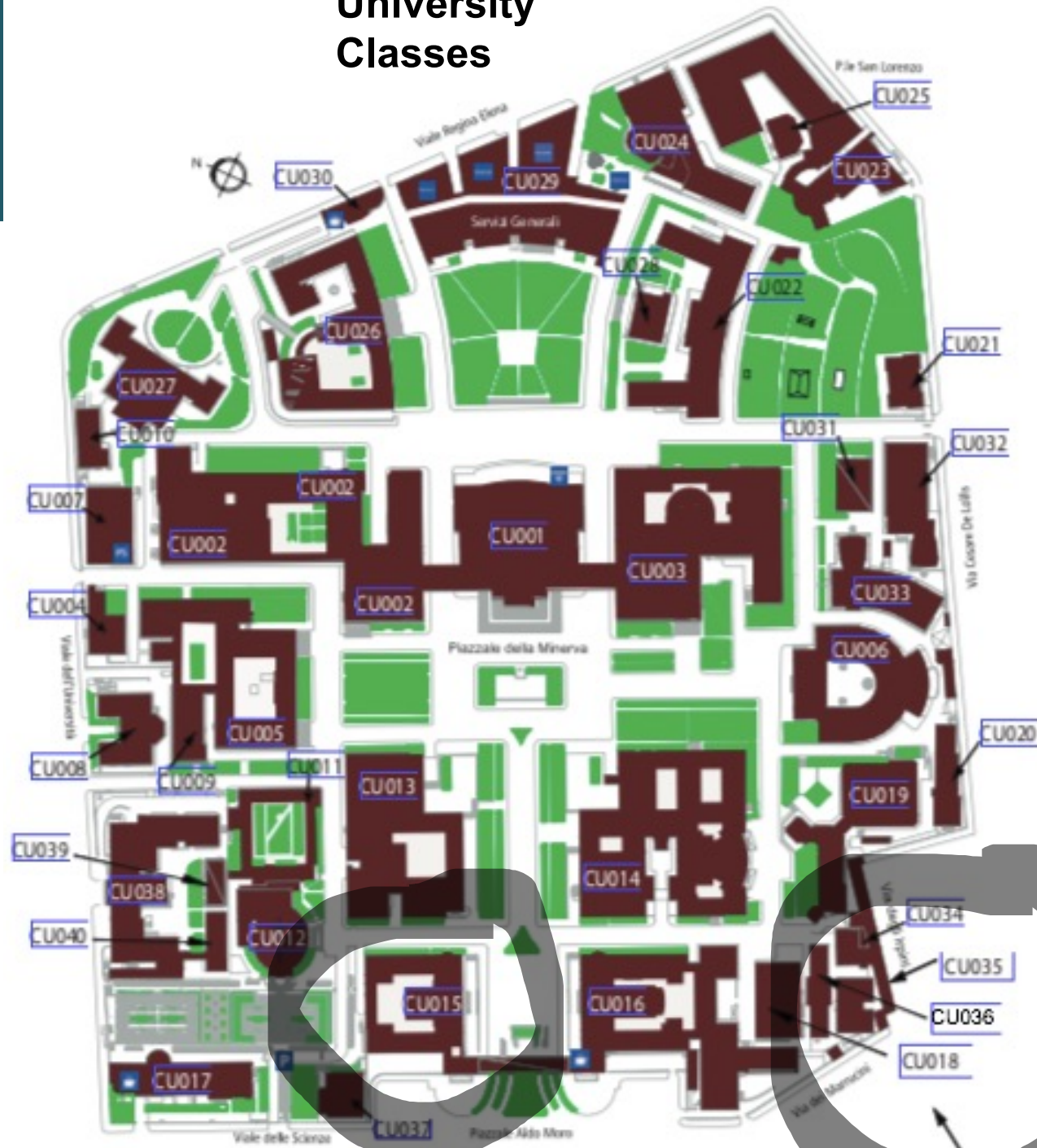

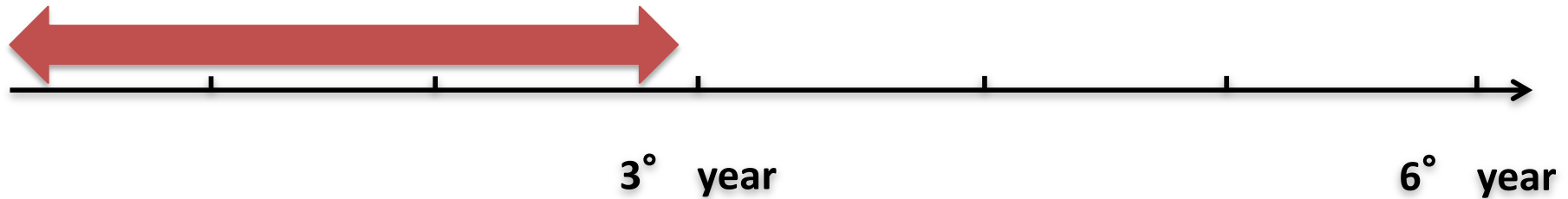

1 st year: 9 courses
1° semester: 5 courses
2° semester: 4 courses

2 nd year: 8 courses
1° semester: 4 courses
2° semester: 4 courses

3 rd year: 8 courses
1° semester: 5 courses
2° semester: 3 courses

Courses : first 3 year-period (*organization and attendance rules*)



- 1. At each course student attendance will be recorded*
- 2. To sit for the exams students should attend at least 67% of the course lessons/ practical activities*
- 3. According to the study regulations, there are no restrictions for students to enrol to the following year of the course, **BUT***

Rules for progression



IMPORTANT:

to sit for the exams of the following years, students must follow the rules shown in the table below.

To sit for the exams of the...	it is mandatory to have passed...
2 nd year	2 exams of the first year
3 rd year	All the exams of the first year
4 th year	All the exams of the first and second year and 1 exam of the third year
5 th year	All the exams of the first, second and third year
6 th year	All the exams of the first, second, third and fourth year and 2 exams of the fifth year

Examination modalities: formal assessment

Written (multiple choice tests, solving a problem)

Oral (discussing, prevalence, pathophysiology, sign symptoms, consequences, therapy of a certain disease or discuss a clinical case)

AIM: Demonstrate student knowledge and skills in written and no written fashion

The grade is expressed according to the following score:

18 (minimum grade)

30 with honors (maximum grade)

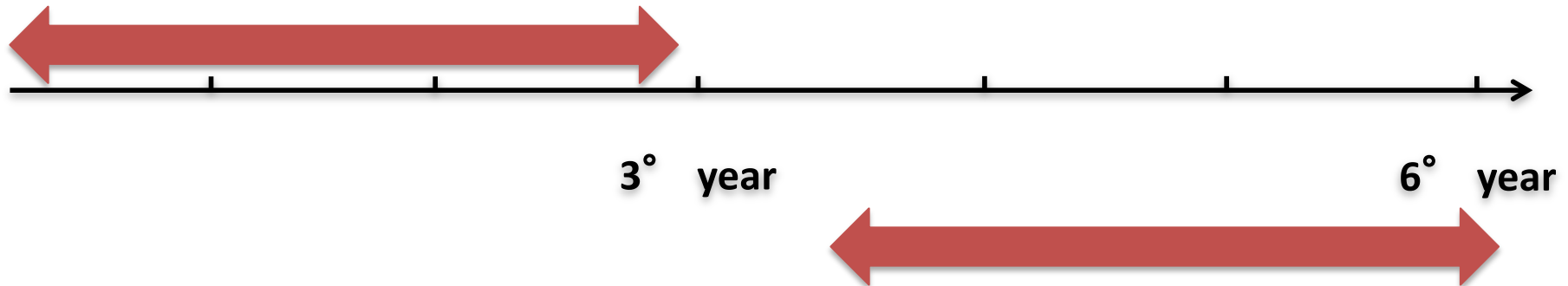

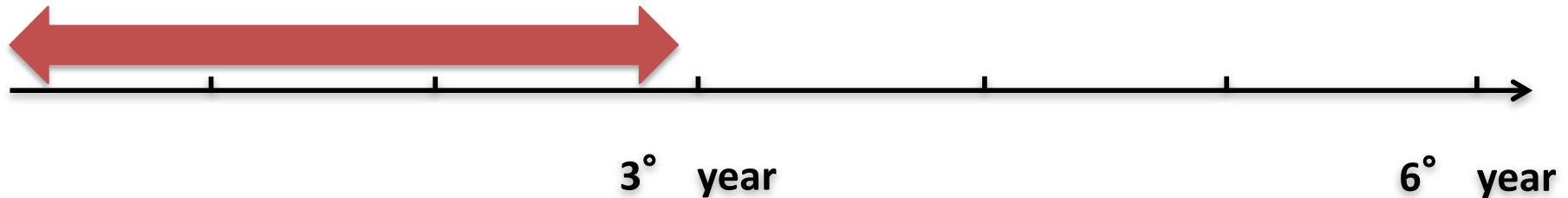

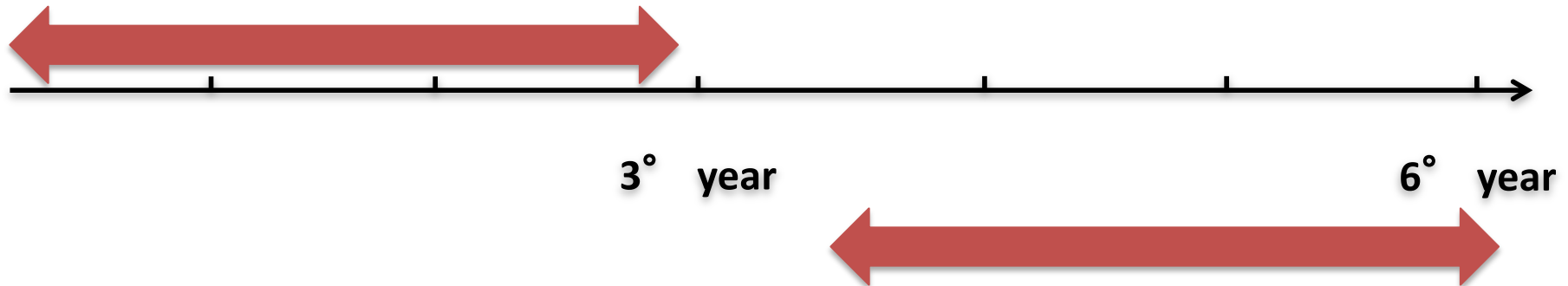

HONOUR PATH : STARTING AT 4TH YEAR



Additional Reserach Program Course for those students that have completed all the exams of the 3^o year in Medicine at the beginning of the 4th year with an average score above 27/30

It is an integrative path and consists of additional training activities to those of the course of study in which the student is enrolled

Interdisciplinary teaching activities and internship which aim to enhance the talent and propensity of the students in the participation/ involvement in research projects, under the guidance of tutors, clinical and/or laboratory professors.

TPVES and Thesis



*TPVES is the **qualifying traineeship for graduating and starts at the 5^o year for every student that has completed all the first 4 year exams on time***

To sit for the Degree course each student should work on a research or clinical program and write and discuss a final thesis (usual duration 2 years)

IMPORTANT: to become fully engaged in this process and in order to acquire practical skills for becoming a doctor you should **understand and speak italian before starting 4th year**

- 40-hour Italian language courses are delivered in-person and/or online during the second semester of the academic reference year (February–June)
- Students must attend at least 70% of the total course hours (28 hours out of 40) in order to be admitted to the final exam and receive a Certificate of attendance stating the student's language proficiency.
- A1 and A2 levels are online and recorded courses
- B1 and B2 are online interactive courses

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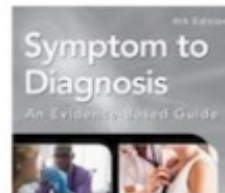
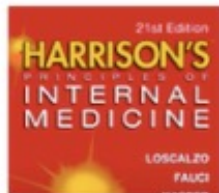

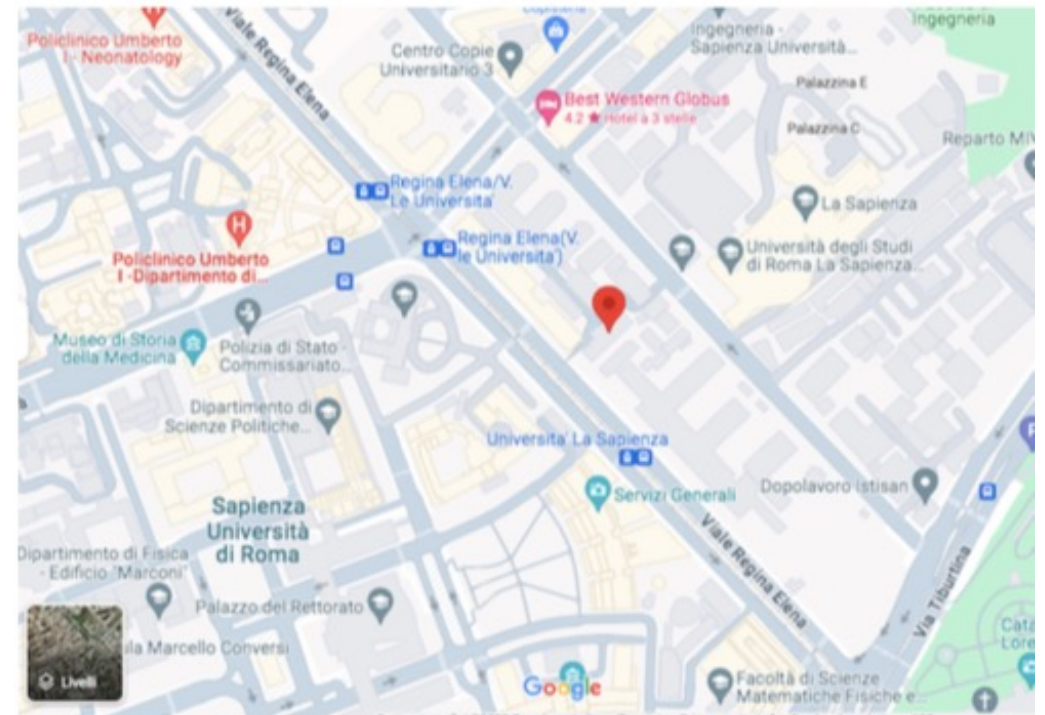
