WHAT is ICAO and WHEN was it established?

The International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) is a United Nations agency which helps 193 countries to cooperate together and share their skies to their mutual benefit.



- > 1943: the United States start studies on possible development of air transport the post-war period;
- ➤ 1944 : on December 7th, 52 States signed for the estabilishment of ICAO during the Chicago Convention;
- ➤ 1947 : on April 4th, Member States recognized ICAO as the only international organization in the sector.

What are ICAO's FUNCTIONS and RESPONSIBILITIES?

Function refers to a set of activities performed by an organization or one of its units to achieve its objectives.

Responsibility refers to the duties and obligations the organization holds towards various stakeholders.


FUNCTIONS

- Global forum of States for international civil aviation;
- Development of Standards and Recommend Practises (SARPs);
- Compliance audits, studies and analyses, assistance to Member States.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- · Air Navigation;
- Air Transport;
- Technical Co-operation;
- Aviation Security.

"GENERAL PRINCIPLE AND APPLICATION OF THE CONVENTION"

ARTICLE 1. Sovereignty



Every state has complete sovereignty over the air space above its territory

ARTICLE 2. Territory



Land areas and territorial waters adjacent thereto under the sovereignty of such State

ARTICLE 3. Civil and state aircraft



This Convention shall be applicable only to civil aircraft, and shall not be applicable to state aircraft

ARTICLE 4. Misuse of civil aviation

Each contracting State agrees not to use civil aviation for any purpose inconsistent with the aims of this Convention.

Why is chapter 1 IMPORTANT?



It is crucial because determines what are the **rights of** a **contracting state** in its national airspace.



It's a **guarantee** of **security** and **regulation of international air traffic**.



Prevents the misusing of civil aviation.

It underscores

the sovereignty of the contracting States in regulating the entry of foreign aircraft into their territories.



The movement of passengers and goods within territories.



Reinforces the **control of States over their borders and economic and commercial activities** in the civil aviation sector.
